# GRANT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

OIBR plays an essential role in facilitating both interdisciplinary and multi-disciplinary scholarship by mentoring early-career faculty in their pursuit of research funding. The OIBR Grant Development Program (GDP) prepares participants to compete successfully for extramural funding.

- » OIBR is a service unit of the Office of Research.
- » The program provides a systematic training experience that includes workshops, seminars, formal mentoring, mock reviews, and staged guidance on proposal preparation.
- » Program participants are expected to submit the grant proposal they are developing in the program through the Institute by the end of year 2 to receive a certificate of completion.
- » Participants are eligible to receive support to cover the cost of external reviews and editing and to apply for pilot funding specific to this program.
- » Indirect cost return (F&A) follows the policies and practices in the faculty members, home academic unit.
- » For grant proposals submitted through OIBR, academic credit is given to the participant's home college/department and institute credit is given to OIBR.
- » UGA faculty members of any rank who have not previously received significant extramural research support as Principal Investigator are eligible to apply to the program.
